- 7. Create a tree map of the three branches of government. Hint: Frame of reference is "checks and balances."
- 8. Create a <u>double bubble map</u> comparing/contrasting the views of **Federalists** and **Anti-Federalists** including the significant individuals involved in the debate.
- 9. Create a <u>circle map</u> to define the **rule of law**.
- 10. Use a <u>flow map</u> to diagram the path to **citizenship**.
- 11. Create a tree map of the *obligations* of **citizens** to obey laws, pay taxes, defend the nation, and serve on juries.
