- **1.** Create a **timeline sequence** that includes the following:
  - -- Mayflower Compact -- US Constitution -- Articles of Confederation
- -- Magna Carta
  - -- Common Sense -- Declaration of Independence -- English Bill of Rights -- VA Declaration of Rights
- 2. Design a tree map using the above info that includes: main points, individuals, & connections among documents.
- 3. Create a <u>double-bubble map</u> to <u>compare/contrast</u> the Articles of Confederation with the Constitution.
- 4. Compare the *responsibilities* of US Citizens (i.e. voting), with the *rights* of US citizens.
- 5. Illustrate the "melting pot theory."
- 6. List the requirements for becoming a *naturalized citizen*.
- 7. What are the *principle criteria* for *citizenship* under the **14th Amendment**?
- 8. Provide at least two examples of how Florida municipalities levy taxes.
- Create a continuum (like a number line) showing the spread in political ideological thought

(liberal/moderate/conservative) and the parties generally identified with each type of ideology.

- <u>Describe</u> the characteristics of political campaigns (qualifications, experience, issue-based platforms, debates & ads).

- **15.** Give an example for each of the **seven** types of **propaganda**.
- <u>Describe</u> how *lobbyists* and *special interest groups* try to influence the political process.

- **20.** Describe the *rule of law* and *rights* of citizens in a *dictatorship* vs. *democracy*.
