


Learning Goal:

• A public policy is an agreed-upon way that our federal, state, or local governments fulfill their responsibilities, such as protecting the rights of individuals and promoting the general welfare of the people.

Lets see how much you know?



- Some are written by legislatures.
- Rules and Regulations created by the <u>executive</u> <u>branch of government</u>, which is responsible for carrying out and enforcing laws.
- Judicial Branch, or courts, can make or change public policy when they reach decisions in some cases.



Who writes public policies?

• School districts are responsible for making policies regarding student behavior and discipline.

Who enforces?

Teachers and school administrators enforce these policies.

- Who makes the laws?
- State Legislators are responsible for making laws that place speed limits on drivers.

• Police officers enforce these laws.

- City governments often adopt policies that prohibit people from operating liquor stores near public schools.
