  - a. Confederal\* (Confederate)
  - b. Federal
- c. Unitary
- d. Parliamentary
- 3. Use a <u>circle map</u> to brainstorm the essential characteristics of "free and fair" elections (SS.7.C.3.1).
- 4. Use a bubble map to describe characteristics of a parliamentary system (SS.7.C.3.2).
- 5. What are the *qualifications* to be **President** of the United States? How many terms may a president of the United States serve? (SS.7.C.3.3)
- 6. Use a **flow map** to illustrate the process for **amending** the US Constitution. (SS.7.C.3.5)
- 7. What is the **purpose** of the *division of powers*? (SS.7.C.3.4)
- 8. **How** are public schools *funded*? (SS.7.C.3.4)
- 9. In your own words, explain the rights contained in the First Amendment. (SS.7.C.3.6)
- 10. What is the overall purpose of the 13<sup>th</sup>, 14<sup>th</sup>, 15<sup>th</sup>, and 24<sup>th</sup> Amendments? (SS.7.C.3.7)
- 11. Use a tree map to organize the similarities and differences of the 15<sup>th</sup>, 19<sup>th</sup>, 24<sup>th</sup>, and 26<sup>th</sup> Amendments.
- 12. Use a <u>Tree Map</u> to *classify* the general **responsibilities** of the three branches of government. (SS.7.C.3.3)
- 13. Rewrite Article 2, Section 3 of the Florida Constitution in your own words. (SS.7.C.3.8)
- 14. Use a **Bubble Map** to characterize representative democracy. (SS.7.C.3.1)
- 15. Use a **Double Bubble** to compare bicameral and unicameral legislatures. (SS.7.C.3.3)
- 16. How are **repr**esentatives and **senators** <u>chosen</u>? Include information on apportionment and redistricting in your answer. (SS.7.C.3.8 & SS.7.C.3.13)
- 17. Use a flow map to illustrate the legislative (lawmaking) process. (SS.7.C.3.9)
  - 18. Which has more power in the legislative process, the House or the Senate? (SS.7.C.3.9)
  - 19. How can citizens directly influence legislation at the state level? (SS.7.C.3.9)
  - 20. What is the purpose of laws? (SS.7.C.3.1)
  - 21. Under what <u>circumstances</u> might **freedom of the press** be *legally restricted*? (SS.7.C.3.6)
  - 22. What is "due process?" Which amendments guarantee it? What are some examples of it? (SS.7.C.3.6)
  - 23. What is "<u>judicial review</u>" and what Supreme Court case established this principle? (SS.7.C.3.8)
  - 24. Use a <u>Double Bubble Map</u> to compare the *powers and responsibilities* of government. (SS.7.C.3.14) \*confederal is the term used in the Next Generation Sunshine State Standards.
