# **Course Description:**

The 8<sup>th</sup> grade social studies curriculum consists of the following content area strands:

American History, Geography, Economics, and Civics. Primary content emphasis for this course pertains to the study of American history from the Exploration and Colonization period to the Reconstruction period following the Civil War. Students will be exposed to the historical, geographic, political, economic, and sociological events which influenced the development of the US and the resulting impact on world history. All Students will be required to participate & complete a History Fair Project per SLCSB's requirement. HF Projects are introduced in class with teacher guidance but are predominantly done at home.

# **Course Requirements:**

Tardiness is unacceptable; students must be in their seats at the beginning of class. If a student is absent, it is the student's responsibility to make up any missed work within two days for each excused absence. Students may obtain missed assignments from a peer, teacher, Class Website or Skyward. A portion of your class participation grade is based upon attendance, so attendance is vital. Adhere to all school policies & class rules.

## **Course Topics:**

1<sup>st</sup> Quarter: Settlement of the American Colonies / American Revolution / Intro to History Fair

2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter: Development of the US / History Fair / College & Career Planning

3<sup>rd</sup> Ouarter: Emergence of an American Identity/ Westward Expansion

4<sup>th</sup> Quarter: Civil War / Reconstruction / College & Career Planning

### **Assignments:**

- Homework is due at the **beginning** of the class period and will be assigned as needed.
- Class work will be collected at the end of the period or may be allowed to finish for homework.
- Assignments **must** be written in pencil, blue or black ink and on loose leaf paper. **Any other color** ink will not be accepted and must be recopied within 24 hours to receive credit.
- All **Projects** are due on the assigned due date. If a student is absent on a project due date, the student must turn it in upon returning to class or in advance, in the case of a scheduled absence.

**<u>Late Work Policy:</u>** Any LATE work must be in the **NEXT** day to receive credit

- 1<sup>st</sup> late assignment may receive **FULL** credit.
- 2<sup>nd</sup> late assignment grade will be reduced by 20%.
- 3<sup>rd</sup> or more late assignments will receive a max of 50% credit.

#### **Materials:**

- 2 Folders with pockets (Red, Blue), a USB storage device is strongly recommended
- 2+ packs of filler paper, 1 pack of Index Cards (ruled/lined 3x5)
- Pencil pouch with pencils, erasers, blue/black ink pens, highlighters, and colored pencils
- (See additional 8<sup>th</sup> Grade supply list) • 2 Composition book (no spiral bounds)

Students must come to class prepared with these supplies along with their West Gate Planners.

#### **Tests and Ouizzes:**

All students present will take test/quizzes on the days they are given. Tests and quizzes are announced at least a week in advance. Students should always study their notes, read their textbooks, and complete their homework to be prepared for assessments.

#### **Projects/Papers:**

There will be several projects/papers assigned each grading period. Projects/Papers consist of developing topics, researching primary and secondary sources, and presenting findings. Projects will likely need a display board and Papers need to be typed and bound. There will be mini-projects occasionally. Rubrics will be issued for each project assigned with clear expectations and grading guidelines to adhere to. (Available on Class Website & Skyward)

Midterm & Final Exams account for 20% of a student's GPA in all academic classes and could possibly be projects and/or other forms of assessment rather than paper & pencil exams.

## **Journals:**

Students are required to have a composition notebook for daily journal entries. A topic will be posted on the board at the beginning of class and a paragraph must be written on the topic. These journals are to remain in the classroom and will be graded weekly. \*DO NOT TAKE HOME\*

# <u>Classroom Policies:</u> (All School-wide rules will be enforced in class)
